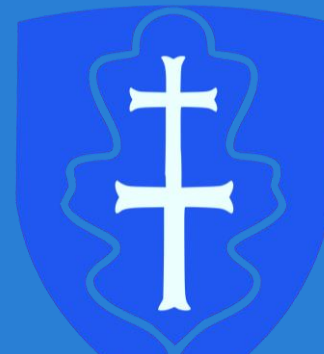

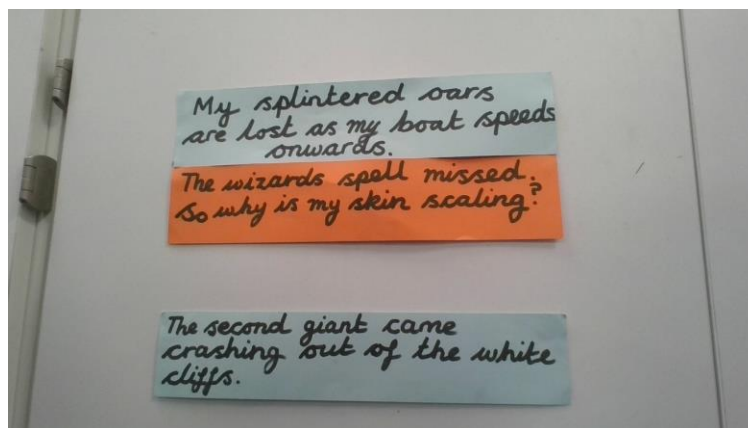
5&6
