<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Stonehenge</u></p> <p>At home, have a go at creating your own model or picture of Stonehenge. What information can you find out about it as well? Can you find out where it is, how old it is or why it might have been built?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>School Values</u></p> <p>Using one of our school values can you create a poem, drawing, rhyme, prayer or anything creative to show what this value means to our school.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Stone Age animals</u></p> <p>Chose an animal that lived in the Stone Age. Create a fact file on this animal. Are they still around today? Did people hunt the animals? What did the animal eat? Where did the animal live? Was the animal used to create clothes or weapons?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Creation</u></p> <p>In RE we have learnt about the Christian story of Creation. Can you create a piece of artwork to show how you interpret it. Remember to include all of the things Christians believe God did on each of the seven days. You could even try the tinting method we have worked on in art.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Elvis Presley</u></p> <p>Who was Elvis Presley? You can find out as much information about the King of Rock and Roll as you like. Listen to his music and decide which is your favourite track? Don't forget to check out his many costumes!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>The Rock Cycle</u></p> <p>Create a poster, power point or informative video on the rock cycle. Have a go explaining how different types of rocks are created and how some then become different types of rocks. How many key words can you use?</p>
